NATIONAL SEMINAR ON

CHALLENGES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS IN INDIA

INTRODUCTION:

Deteriorating health, malnutrition, lack of shelter, fear, depression, senility, isolation, boredom, non-productivity, and financial incapacity are the most common problems that senior citizens all over the world face today.

These problems can be grouped into two categories that relate to the A) Physical and Mental Health and B) Financial Capacity of the senior citizens.

As is well known, India is a young country, 50% of the population is below 25 years of age and 65% are below 35. But 8.6% of Indians are above 60, according to the 2011 Census. That works out to over 110 million people today. Should the dazzle of the anticipated demographic dividend blind us to the plight of this large and growing group? They are not a very educated lot. Literacy among the 60-plus is 44%, up from 27% in 1991. Once you hit 60, you can expect to live on for almost 18 more years, on average. The Problems of Senior Citizens of our country and their solutions are definitely different from those adopted in most of the developed countries. We have to seek the solutions within our socio-economic framework. DATES:

TRAVEL:

No Travel Grant is available with organizers for Participants. All participants including institutional members and others have to arrange their own Travel.
